### Application Materials Checklist

The Office Graduate Admissions (OGA) process applications for graduate admissions. To apply for graduate admission to the School of Nursing, complete the electronic application at [Graduate School Application for Admission](#) during the open application periods **September 1 through June 1**.

The following documents must be uploaded via the [Online Status Check](#) page

- **Application-** OGA process applications for graduate admission. Applications are to be completed and paid on the application site. For additional information on Graduate admissions, please visit the [University of Texas at Austin Graduate School](#) webpage.
- **Official Transcript(s)** from each **academic institution** you have attended. Upload a copy of official transcripts dated one year or less; if admitted official, hard copy, transcripts are required.
- Current **Curriculum Vitae (CV)** indicating educational background, professional experience, volunteer experience and other relevant information (e.g. publications, scholarship and awards, professional organizations and community activities).
- **Statement of Purpose**, double spaced, 1-inch margins, 12-point and maximum length of 2 pages, addressing the following:
  - Discuss your interest in doctoral education in nursing.
  - Describe your career goals and potential for leadership.
  - Describe how you anticipate doctoral education in nursing will help you meet your goals and enhance your leadership potential.
  - Explain how your professional experiences will enhance your experience in this DNP program.
- **Three references.** Provide the name, position and email address for three recommenders on the application for admissions. Recommenders are sent an email with instructions on completing the online recommendation form.
  - **Written recommendations are not accepted.**
